- Able to diagnose and treat common ailments that affect dairy cows, artificial insemination, understanding the mechanics of the milking system and various farm equipment, understanding crops and forage production, accounting, computer skills and an in-depth knowledge of genetics.
- Leadership skills are key to helping grow the business and manage employees.
- Accurate record keeping is needed to know current profitability and the cost of production.
- Good verbal communication skills.

### **Network Development**

- Participate in extension programs, breed associations, state dairy associations, cooperative and processor meetings.
- Build relationships with A.I. companies, nutritionists, veterinarians, dairy specialists and milking equipment companies.
- Attend events like the Young Dairy Leaders Institute for valuable learning experiences.

#### **Work Experience**

- Seek internships on various farms.
- Work for other farms to gain valuable experiences and learn from others.
- Continue education to keep current with labor and tax laws, Farmers Assuring Responsible Management (FARM) program standards etc.
- Shadow producers in the industry to gain on-farm knowledge.
